# MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

#### Phil Harding Mayor

To say this term of Council has dealt with challenging issues would be an understatement. Three months into this term we declared a state of emergency due to the 1:300 year flood. Just nine months later, the worldwide COVID-19 pandemic began which caused us to pivot and change how we provided services. Through these unprecedented situations, we continued to provide services and move the business of the municipality forward. I could not be more proud of our Council and staff.



As we reflect on this term, a key takeaway has been respectful engagement. Some of the highlights from the past 4 years include: implementation of a new committee structure, introduction of webcasting for Committee and Council meetings, development of a new four year Strategic Plan and completion of the Official Plan review.

Council has spent a considerable amount of time establishing plans and strategies to guide decisions made by the municipality for the next 5, 10 and 20 years. Each of these plans will help to identify priority areas and projects, allowing the Township to direct capital project investments in a strategic manner.

While these plans and strategies have a longer-term focus, we also continued to update/enhance the core infrastructure in the Township including several large projects such as: the replacement of the Milford Bay Bridge; rehabilitation of the Bala Falls and Beaumaris Bridges and the Moon River, Baycliffe, and Portage Docks. Additionally, environmental assessments were completed for both the Burgess 1 Dam and the Bala Falls Bridge.

I think the most significant accomplishment this term is the drastic reduction in annual tax increases while also building reserves and increasing our staff compliment to meet the unprecedented increase in workload demands on our By-Law, Planning and Building Departments. Financial responsibility remains our underlying priority in everything we do.

# 2019 **FLOOD**

On April 28th, 2019 at 11:34 a.m. Mayor Phil Harding declared a State of Emergency for the Township of Muskoka Lakes under the Emergency Management & Civil Protection Act due to the rising water levels in the area. During this time, the Township activated its Emergency Plan, and the Emergency Control Group reacted accordingly. The Emergency declaration was lifted on May 16th, 2019 as water levels were receding and recovery efforts continued.
